E-mail: secretary@llanilarshow.co.uk with the entry fee of 25p per exhibit on or before Monday 9th August 2010 and should state whether member of YFC, Llanilar WI or Merched Y Wawr Bro Ilar. Garden competition entries to be in by 6th July 2010 and judging will take place for Gardens in mid-July
2. Exhibitors are not allowed more than two entries in each class.
3. Only exhibitors are allowed within the Marquee when entries are being set up.
4. Exhibits should be staged between 9am and 10.30am. Judging will begin at 11am prompt.
5. Exhibitors must place under each exhibit a card with his/her name and address. All cards will be supplied by stewards. No other cards will be allowed.
6. Exhibits must not be removed before the end of the presentation of prizes.
7. Prize money must be collected on day of Show – any prize money left over will be taken as a donation to Show funds.
8. While the stewards will do their best to supervise, no responsibility is taken for loss or damage.
9. Flowers are to be exhibited in vases, except where otherwise specified.
10. All exhibits must be the property of and grown by the exhibitor. In case of doubt, the committee may visit the gardens.
11. Only stewards are allowed in the tent during judging.
12. Exhibitors paying £5 or more in entry fees in the Horticultural and Industrial Sections will receive a complimentary ticket.
13. Judges should award First, Second and Third prizes in each Class unless the exhibit is not in accordance with the schedule.
14. The present holders of cups etc. should return them to the Secretary one week before the show.

Line a 7" cake tin. Halve the cherries, wash and dry thoroughly. Sift the flours and cornflour. Stir in the ground almond and cherries. Cream the butter and sugar until pale and fluffy and beat in the egg a little at a time. Fold in the dry ingredients. Put the mixture into the cake tin making sure that the cherries are not grouped together and hollow the centre slightly. Bake in the centre of the oven (180°C, 350°F, mark 4) for 1-1½ hours until well risen and golden. Turn out onto a wire rack to cool.
